Saying "please" and "thank you" to other students and teachers.	Not using your mobile phone when you are not supposed to.
Making it to class on time and being prepared.	Taking good care of the materials and property in the classroom.
Displaying acts of kindness to other students.	Using the ICT facilities correctly and following directions.


In some countries they don't have the Rule of Law. Instead their country is governed by dictators who do not follow the laws
