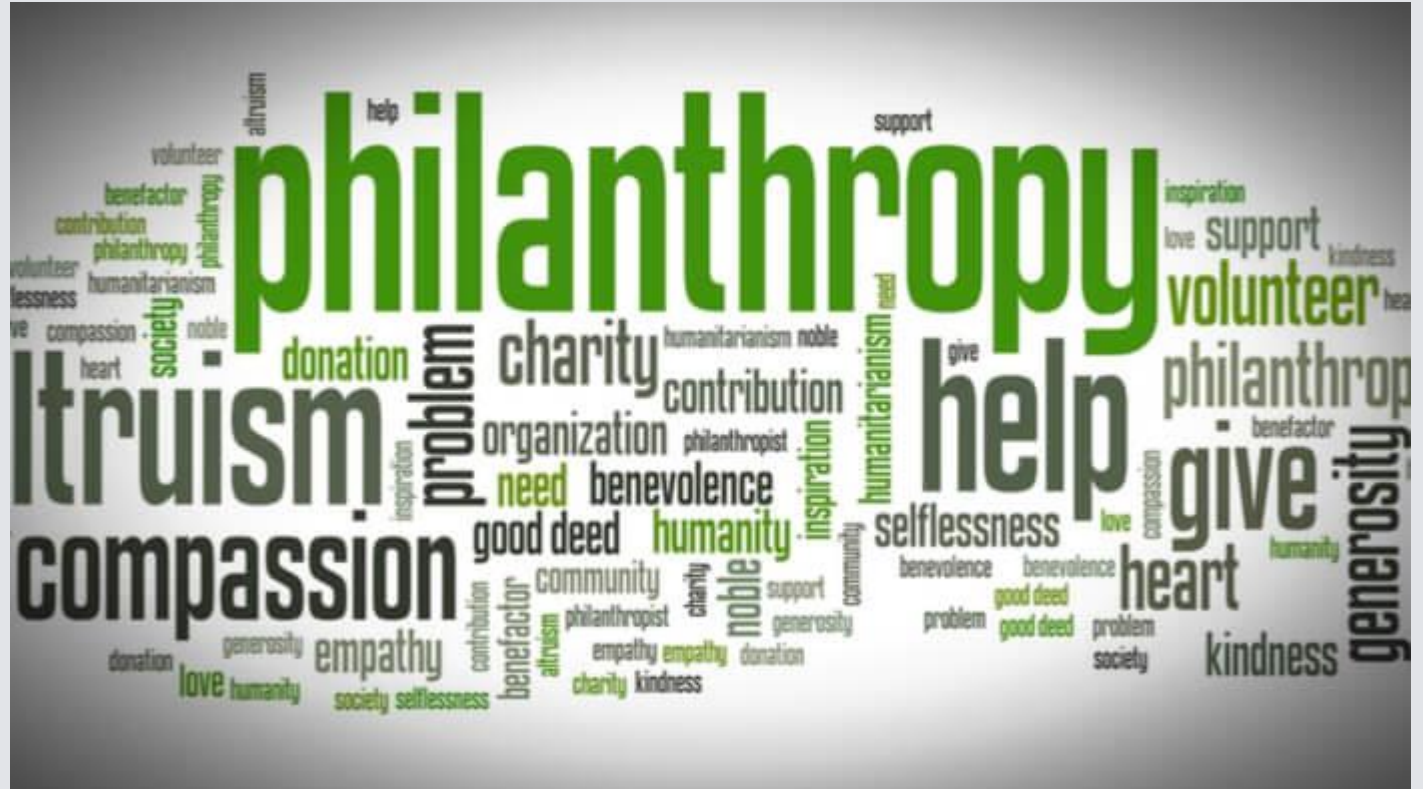
A charitable organization or charity is an organization whose primary objectives are philanthropy and social well-being.

*Philanthropy - The desire to promote the welfare of others, expressed especially by the generous donation of money to good causes.

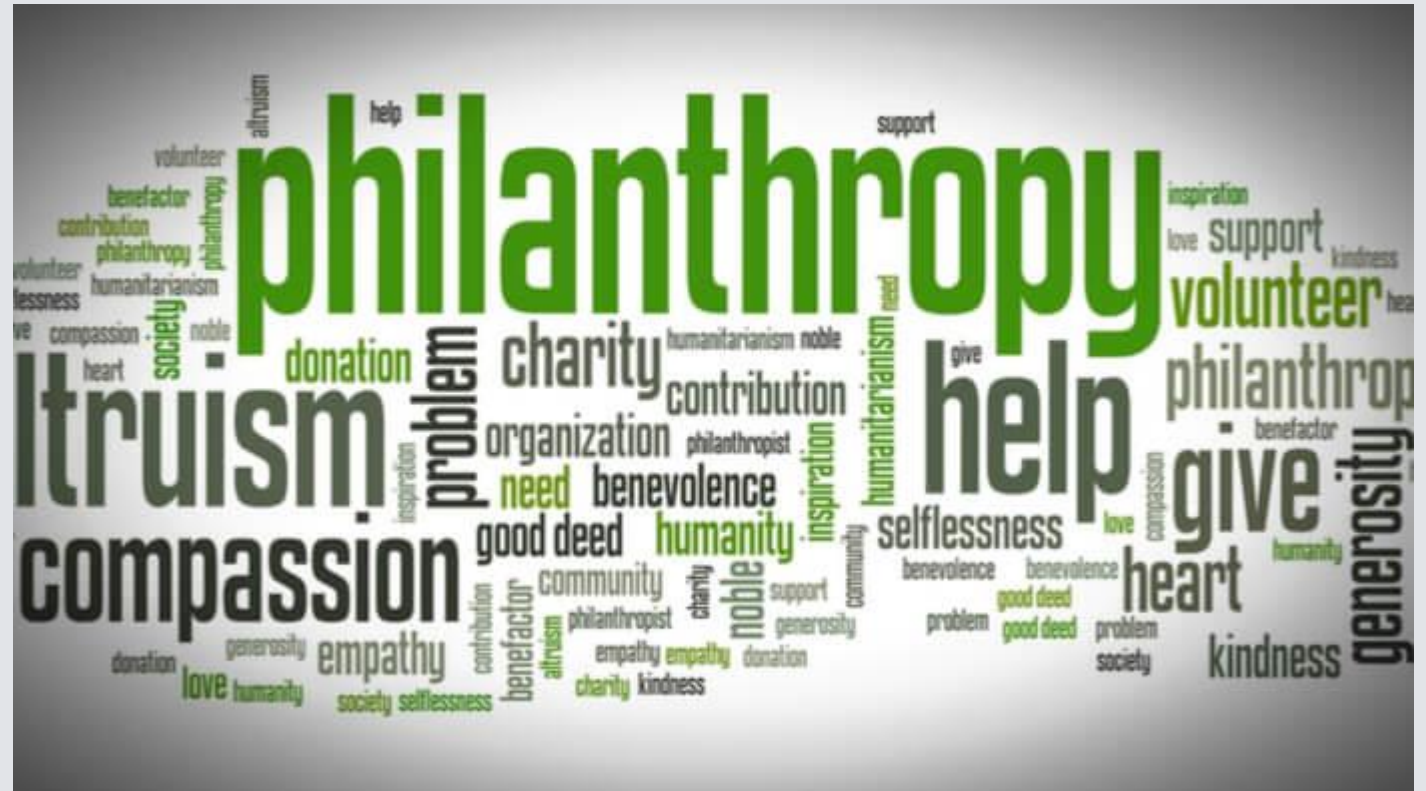


What is charity?

So philanthropy is about looking after other people and their needs when they are not able to look after themselves properly. A charity needs people to donate money in order for it to be able to look after members of our society who are in need of help.

The parable of the Rich Fool

(Luke 12:16-21)

Jesus tells the story of a rich man who is a successful businessman tempted by greed. One year he has a brilliant harvest and has too many crops to fit into his barns. His thriving business has put him in a quandary: His barns are too small, so he builds bigger barns to store his wealth and coast into the future. He says to himself "You have plenty of grain laid up for many years. Take life easy; eat, drink and be merry."

But, life changes and his money can't solve his spiritual problems. Focusing on an earthly investment and hoarding money for himself did not pay off for him and he died with no one remembering who he was. Jesus instructions are to live by faith and don't trust in worldly wealth. Instead, sell your possessions and give to the poor. This will reap an unstoppable reward and grow a heart toward God. Seeing the future clearly helps us hold loosely to the things of today.

So this parable is trying to tell us that focusing on material possessions and spending money on ourselves is not the answer to happiness. Giving, helping people and acts of kindness are far more important!

What and who is a philanthropist?

A **philanthropist** is a person who donates time, money, experience, skills or talent to help create a better world. Anyone can be a **philanthropist**, regardless of status or net worth.

A well known philanthropist is Bill Gates. Gates has given away nearly \$50 billion over the years to various non-profit making organisations. Gates is someone who realises that people who are incredibly wealthy owe it to the world to give back. The Bill and Melinda Gates Foundation was founded in 2000 to “improve the quality of life for individuals around the world.” With billions of dollars to use, the foundation has done everything from providing educational resources in Chicago to healthcare support in Nigeria.

ANOTHER EXAMPLE IS WARREN BUFFETT:

Since the year 2000, Warren Buffett has given more than \$46 billion to charity and is commonly known as one of the world's biggest philanthropists. He is the chairman and CEO of Berkshire Hathaway. Buffett has given portions of his wealth to the Bill and Melinda Gates Foundation, the Susan Thompson Buffett Foundation, the Howard G. Buffett Foundation, Sherwood Foundation and the NoVo Foundation. So far he has donated \$37 billion of his money to charities worldwide. Not only has this famous philanthropist given away a substantial chunk of his own wealth, but he has also helped put in place a charge for other ultra-rich individuals to do the same. In 2010, Buffet and Bill and Melinda Gates launched The Giving Pledge, urging billionaires to publicly dedicate the majority of their wealth to philanthropy
