Hope as a verb:

to want something to happen or to be true, and usually have a good reason to think that it might:

I'm hoping for an interview next week.

She's hoping (that) she won't be away too long.

I hope (that) she'll win.

They hope to visit us next year.

"Will you be at the meeting tomorrow?" "I hope not/so".

Hope as a noun:

something good that you want to happen in the future, or a confident feeling about what will happen in the future:

What are your hopes and dreams for the future?

Is there any hope that they will be home in time?

They have pinned all their hopes on their new player.

The letter offered us ray of hope.

I didn't phone until four o'clock in the hope that you'd be finished.

I don't hold out much hope of getting a ticket.

"We are hoping for something we do not have yet, and we are waiting for it patiently"





is one of South Africa's most well-known human rights activists, winning the 1984 Nobel Peace Prize for his efforts in resolving and **ending** apartheid. Born in 1931 in Klerksdorp, Transvaal, South Africa, he became the first Black Anglican Archbishop of both Cape Town and Johannesburg.

He emphasized nonviolent means of protest and encouraged the application of economic pressure by countries dealing with South Africa.

What does the Quran say about 'hope'?

Some Quranic verses and a hadith that reflect the Islamic view about "Hope."

- ...And whosoever fears Allah...He will make a way for him to get out (from every difficulty). And He will provide him from (sources) he never could imagine.

 Quran 65:2-3
- ...After a difficulty, Allah will soon grant relief. Quran <u>65:7</u>
- So, verily, with every difficulty, there is relief: Verily with every difficulty there is relief. Therefore, when you are free (from your immediate task), still labour hard. And to your Lord turn (all) your attention.

 Quran 94:5-7
