What is pride?



- Pride is an entire month dedicated to the celebration of LGBTQ people, raising awareness of homophobia and reflecting on the progress made towards equality and acceptance.
- This includes parades, protests, drag performances, live theatre and memorials to those who lost their lives during the AIDS crisis.
- It is currently celebrated each year in the month of June to honour the Stonewall Uprising in 1969.
- Pride is still important because LGBTQ people face discrimination every day and it is all our responsibilities to show solidarity and tackle homophobia by calling out malicious behaviour.







Where it all began

The Stonewall Riots began on the 28th June 1969 when NYC police raided the Stonewall Inn.

This sparked a riot among queer people against police brutality, leading to six days of protests and violent clashes with law enforcement.

The Stonewall Uprising was a tipping point for the LGBTQ movement in the West and we owe this to the lesbians and trans women of colour such as Marsha P Johnson, Stormé DeLarverie and Sylvia Rivera who started the revolution.

LGBTQIA meaning



Lesbian - attraction to women
Gay - attraction to men
Bisexual - attraction to more than one gender
Transgender - gender identity different from assigned gender at birth
Queer - umbrella term for anyone who is not

straight or cisgender Intersex - biological sex characteristics which

are not typically male or female

Asexual - no or little sexual attraction

Other terminology



Homosexual - attraction to the same sex

Non-binary - someone who isn't female or male

Pansexual - attraction regardless of gender identity

Aromantic - no or little romantic attraction

Heterosexual - attraction to different sex

Cisgender - gender identity matches the gender assigned at birth
















Pride in other ways
