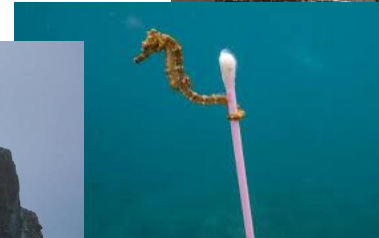
What is a global citizen and what does a good global citizen do?

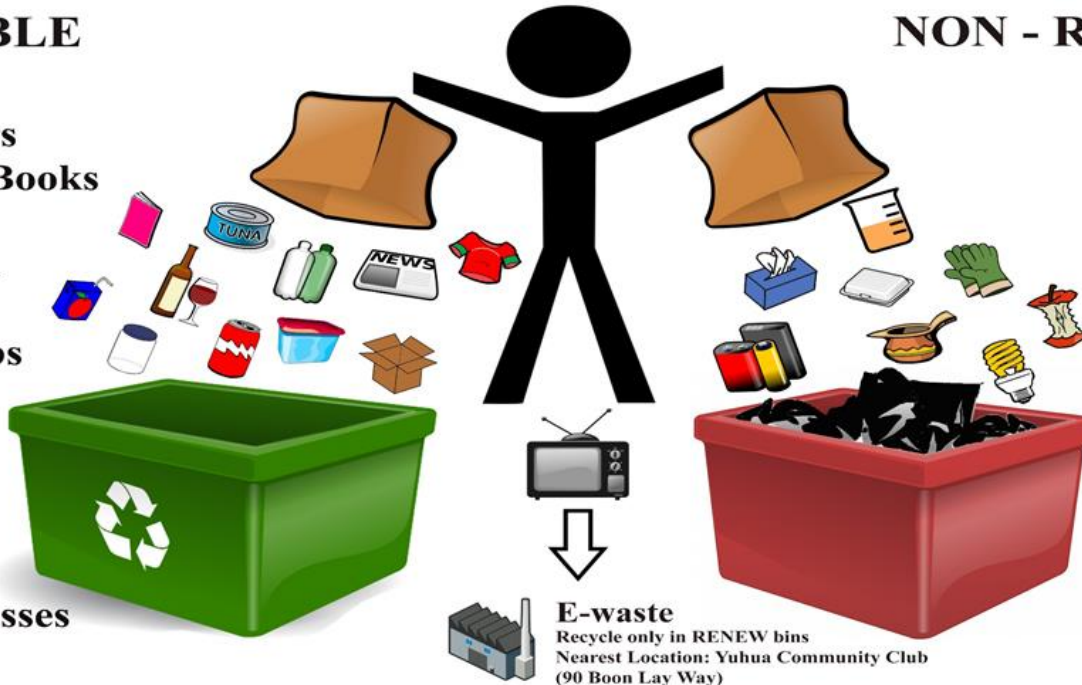

QUESTIONS

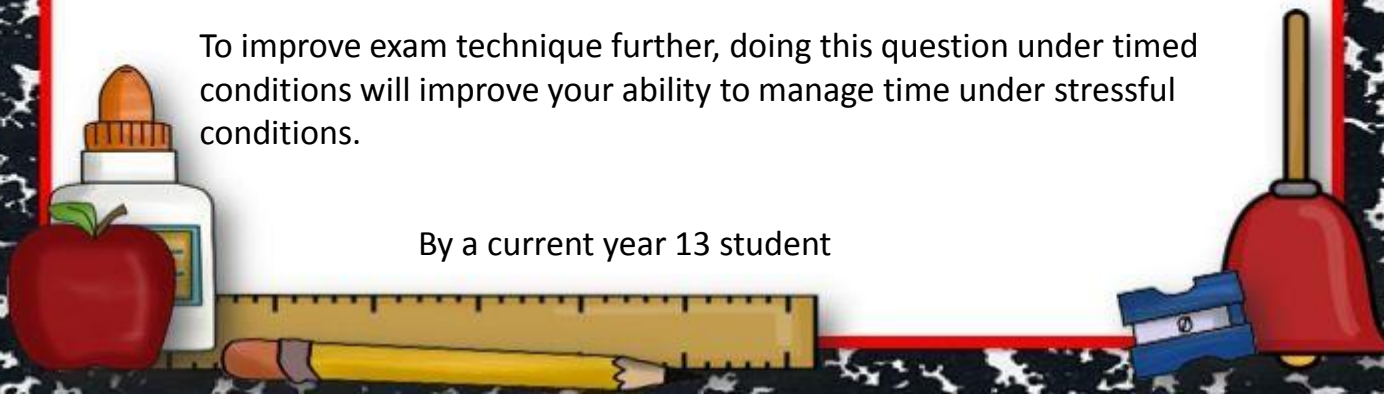
Although it takes a while, writing a long mark essay question covers all aspects of a topic, ultimately preparing you for any short mark questions that may arise on the same subject.
