Example Entry Requirements

BSc (Hons) Psychology

- 112 UCAS tariff points
- A Level: BBC
- IB Points: 30
- BTEC: DMM

Example Entry Requirements

BEng (Hons) Mechanical Engineering

- GCSE English Language 4/C
- UCAS Tariff Points: 112-120
- A Levels: BBB-BBC, including B in Maths and either Physics, Chemistry, Engineering or similar
- BTEC: DDM-DMM Extended Diploma in Engineering with Distinction in Further Mathematics
- IB: 31 points including grade 5 in HL Maths and Physics

What is a Personal Statement?

A Personal Statement is an essential part of your UCAS application

Why are YOU applying?

Why would YOU be suitable for the course?

Why does the university need YOU?

Is the Personal Statement Changing?

- For 2025 entry
- NOT for current year 12s
- Same general idea but questions to help you with the structure

How long is a Personal Statement?

- 47 lines
- 4000 characters
- Approx. 500 words
- Approx. 1 side A4



How many courses can you apply for?

- You can apply for up to 5 courses
- Apply for up to 4 courses in:
 - Medicine
 - Dentistry
 - Veterinary Science/Medicine
- Apply to Oxford or Cambridge, not both.

How much does it cost to apply?

£22.50

What do universities do next?

- Invitation to interview/portfolio
- Decision sent by universities
 - Unconditional Offer
 - Conditional Offer
 - Unsuccessful Application
- Applicant Days



Your Responses

- Firm Acceptance
- Insurance Acceptance
- Decline
 - Decline all offers



UCAS Extra

- Add choices one at a time
- If you:
 - Have no offers
 - Have declined all offers to apply for something different

Clearing

- Apply directly to universities
- If you:
 - Have no offers
 - Have not met the conditions of your offers
 - Apply after 30 June

Results Day

- Most Clearing activity happens on results day
- Call universities directly or contact online
- Be prepared with backup choices
- Don't panic!





Student Finance



Tuition fee loan

- Available to all.
- Not dependent on family income.
- Repaid only when you finish or leave your course, and when income is over the repayment threshold.



Maintenance Ioan

- Covers living costs.
- Amount depends on where you live and on household income.
- Paid into your bank account in three instalments.
- Repaid only when you finish or leave your course, and when income is over the repayment threshold.



student finance england the student finance experts

For a course that starts in September 2024, the student finance application form opens March 2024 and the deadline is in May 2025.

- The earlier you apply the better
- You don't want a delay in receiving your maintenance loan if you need to pay for rent, bills etc.
- You do not need a confirmed place to apply.



Scholarships

- Linked to academic results or achievement.
- Can be subject specific.
- Usually have limited availability.








Bursaries

- Linked to personal circumstances & household income.
- Take the form of discounted accommodation, tuition fees, or financial aid.
- Share your circumstances with the university so they can support you.



NHS Training Grant

- Minimum of £5,000 per year.
- For Nursing, Midwifery, Paramedic Science, Physiotherapy, and Occupational Therapy.
- Non-repayable and non-means tested grant.
- In addition to existing student finance support - does not replace the maintenance loan.



DSA

- Students can get up to £25,575 a year for support including:
 - specialist equipment
 - o non-medical helpers
 - extra travel
 - other disability-related study support.
- Processed by SFE.

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
