#### **Managing Fear and Anxiety**

Returning to school can be a difficult time for some students, especially after the long summer holiday or on transfer from primary school. Some students experience feelings of fear and anxiety, which if not controlled can significantly hamper their mental well-being and achievements. We would like all students to recognise that fear is a natural and controllable response and to have tools at hand to manage it, both for themselves and their peers.




