Mathematics Homework

As part of the maths homework at CHA, students should have 2 homework's a week. This term, one homework will be set by the class teacher and will relate to the subject content being taught. The second homework will be a retrieval/revision homework set as a department. This might be a homework booklet, GCSE revision questions or in Year 11 this could also include past papers.

Students who have the homework booklet are expected to complete one homework sheet a week. The deadline for the homework will be shown on Show My Homework. Students are expected to have the booklets in school on the deadline so they can be marked.

Students who have questions or past papers will be told via SMHW which questions to do each week. Their teacher may ask them to do certain question to help with their learning/revision.

We are hoping to give students in year 11 a past paper every 2 weeks. A walk-through video for each paper will be posted on Show My Homework. We are encouraging students to be independent learners and take responsibility for their preparation and revision for their mocks and ultimately their exams in May/June. Students can pause the video when the question appears, attempt to answer the questions and then watch the solution on the video.

Students will be receiving the revision/ retrieval work this week or at the beginning of next week.




