Last week some of our Y8 students visited Somerville College, part of Oxford University. It was a fantastic opportunity to raise student aspirations and give them a taste of university life. Somerville College was originally created for women only, when universities refused them entry, and remained an all-female college until 1992. Now Somerville female and male students represent the world, and many go on to change that world too.

There are many famous alumni from Somerville including:

- Margaret Thatcher, Prime Minister of the UK
- Marjorie Bolton, British author and poet (taught by C.S Lewis and J.R.R Tolkein)
- Indira Gandhi, Prime Minister of India
- Dorothy Hodgkin, Nobel Prize winning scientist
- Esther Rantzen, TV personality



When the students arrived, they were given a talk on 'Why University' and 'Why Oxford?' and had a guided tour of the college. Afterwards, lunch was served in the vast dining hall, then the students had a walking tour of Oxford to see St John's. The last stop was the Museum where the students took part in a mini workshop. It was an incredibly inspiring day which the students thoroughly enjoyed.
