Rugby has 'kicked off' at Chiltern Hills Academy

Last week, Chiltern Hills Academy fielded its first ever rugby team in a mixed Y8 and Y9 fixture against Chalfont Community College. The winter weather and the fading light made for an interesting encounter, but CHA made a solid start. A strong set piece enabled the backs to begin to play more expansive attacking rugby. Some quick decision making and control at the base of the breakdowns by scrum-half Stan enabled Captain, and new addition to the Bucks County squad, Charlie, to finish a well worked try in the corner for a 5-0 lead. Despite some dodgy refereeing by Mr Callender in the fading light, both teams battled hard, and opportunities came and went thanks to strong and effective defensive work. Both teams played the game in the right spirit and both coaches agreed a draw was the





right result! The CHA squad are looking forward to their next game, and a return fixture with CCC. in the meantime, they will all focus on developing skills in training.

The fantastic rugby facilities at our school have been missing just one thing: teams. Mr Callender has arrived at the school and set his sights on expanding the already brilliant selection of extra-curricular clubs offered by the committed PE staff. Since September the rugby club, run Thursdays after school, has been well attended by students in Y9. The hope is that more students across Y7-9 will want to try out this new and exciting club. As a school we are aiming to field teams across each of the year groups as well as a key stage 3 and key stage 4 girl's teams. WORKS INFORMATION AND NOTIFICATION LETTER:

Chartridge Lane and Park Road, Chesham

We are writing to inform you that Buckinghamshire Highways will be carrying out Footway Reconstruction works along <u>Chartridge Lane and Park Road</u>, between Berkley Avenue and St Mary's Way.

The works are programmed to take place from Monday 20th November 2023 until the 22nd December 2023. We will then suspend the works due to the Christmas holidays and then recommence the works on the 08th January 2024, and it is anticipated the works will be completed by 27th January 2024. The works will be carried out using footway closures and localised diversions, however multi-way lights may be required in sections where there are adjacent side roads. Working hours will be between 7am and 7pm.

Information signs will be erected on site prior to the commencement of the works, giving actual dates and durations. You will appreciate that works of this nature are extremely weather dependant and therefore may be subject to disruption due to adverse weather. If the works are delayed, the advance information signs on site will be updated to reflect any changes.

Every effort will be made to maintain access for residents, although there may be times when it is not safe to do so, and we apologise for any inconvenience. It is vital that vehicles are not parked on the road and/or footway as this will prevent the works from being completed.

We apologise for any inconvenience caused.
