School Christmas Dinner 2023

This year we will be running **Christmas dinner on Wednesday 13 December 2023,** if there is a large uptake then this may well be done over two days due to the large number of students we have in the school.

The Pantry will be offering a traditional Christmas dinner, as shown on the attached menu, which includes a vegetarian option. They will also be offering food from the 'Grab & Go' counter on each of these days at dinner time for those students not having the traditional Christmas dinner.

The cost of Christmas dinner is £3.31 per student payable via ParentPay. Please note that this is a separate payment item. Christmas dinner cannot be purchased through the normal Dinner money item on ParentPay. Christmas dinners are available on a first come, first served basis of payment. When paying please comment in the 'Notes' box whether you require a 'Turkey' or 'Vegetarian' main meal, as food will be ordered specifically for you. Please also use the notes box to state any allergies or special dietary requirements.

If your child has dinner from the 'Grab & Go' counter on these days and not the Christmas dinner, then food is purchased in the normal way with funds coming from the Dinner Money payment item on ParentPay. Please ensure that your account is topped up in the normal way.



Students in receipt of free school meals will be entitled to a free dinner on these days, again Christmas dinners are limited and students in receipt of free school meals will need to email Mrs Dell at office@chacademy.co.uk to reserve a Christmas dinner. For those in receipt of free school meals who do not reserve a Christmas dinner, a meal deal dinner will be available at the Grab & Go counter.

Party hats and squash will be available on each table for students having Christmas dinner.

The closing date on ParentPay and also for those on free school meals to contact Mrs Dell, is 12.00pm on **Friday 1 December 2023.** No orders will be taken after this time.

A ticket to obtain Christmas dinner will be issued to your child via their form tutor on the day of their sitting.

Mental Health Support in our Community

It can be challenging for parents/carers to tell whether their teenagers are just "being teens" or if there is something more serious going on. Changing moods, becoming distant, spending time in their bedrooms are some of the things you may notice, but can often be attributed to normal teenage behaviour. However, it can be helpful to know when there may be signs of a more serious problem. If you're worried about your teenager's behaviour or general wellbeing you should consider:

- Talking to your teenager about your worries
- Getting advice from a GP
- Making contact with school staff

It's important to know that many parents/carers find teenage behaviour difficult to understand or challenging to cope with. There is always someone to talk to here at Chiltern Hills Academy such as:

Some of our students visited John Ayling, an established Media agency with clients ranging from Metro newspaper, RSPCA, & Crystal Palace. Students were given a brief and had to identify target audience media channels and how they can use media to creatively deliver the advertising message.



At Creative Culture marketing consultancy, students focused on looking at local trends and cultural differences to create insights helping clients with their marketing. Clients include Hyatt, Decathalon, Hager, AXA, Western Union, Jim Beam. Our students got involved in deconstructing client briefs and coming up with strategic direction.

WORKS INFORMATION AND NOTIFICATION LETTER:

Chartridge Lane and Park Road, Chesham

We are writing to inform you that Buckinghamshire Highways will be carrying out Footway Reconstruction works along <u>Chartridge Lane and Park Road</u>, between Berkley Avenue and St Mary's Way.

The works are programmed to take place from Monday 20th November 2023 until the 22nd December 2023. We will then suspend the works due to the Christmas holidays and then recommence the works on the 08th January 2024, and it is anticipated the works will be completed by 27th January 2024. The works will be carried out using footway closures and localised diversions, however multi-way lights may be required in sections where there are adjacent side roads. Working hours will be between 7am and 7pm.

Information signs will be erected on site prior to the commencement of the works, giving actual dates and durations. You will appreciate that works of this nature are extremely weather dependant and therefore may be subject to disruption due to adverse weather. If the works are delayed, the advance information signs on site will be updated to reflect any changes.

Every effort will be made to maintain access for residents, although there may be times when it is not safe to do so, and we apologise for any inconvenience. It is vital that vehicles are not parked on the road and/or footway as this will prevent the works from being completed.

We apologise for any inconvenience caused.
