It's a <u>BIG</u> decision to make at Year 11... So we've put together this presentation to help you better understand and map out your future.





BTEC Level 3 Extended Diploma (counts 3 A Levels)

BTECs are an alternative to A Levels.

What are BTECs?

- More vocational and practical, which may suit both your learning style and what you want to do after you finish your studies.
- ✓ If you know what career you're working towards, a practical BTEC is arguably more useful than an A-level since you'll be starting to get the real skills you need for the career you want.

Is a BTEC going to stand in the way of a university place?

✓ Not anymore but CHECK with the university you are applying to.

How are they graded?

✓ Pass, Merit, Distinction or Distinction* grade.




Pathway 2 – College Courses

- ✓ Taking one T Level is the equivalent of three A Levels, and the focus is on one particular area,
- ✓ T Levels are also graded by Pass, Merit, Distinction or Distinction *, and give a thorough grounding in the knowledge and experience needed for a career in the given subject.
