I BELONG IN COMPUTING – EMPOWERING GIRLS





As part of our careers initiative to try and encourage more girls to consider a career in technology, a group of 10 girls from Year 8 took part in I Belong in Computing: Empowering Girls at Bletchley Park last Friday.

Bletchley Park is the birth place of modern computing. Nearly 10,000 women worked there during World War 2 (making up 75% of the workforce). Most of the women were hired straight out of school or college and were brilliant problem solvers or mathematicians.

Our girls discovered the story of the amazing achievements of the WW2 codebreakers in the very place it happened and explored some of the 11 historic buildings and the iconic mansion where it all began. They took part in past, present and future encryption sessions, heard from inspiring speakers and marvelled at the extraordinary achievements made by brilliant minds and complex machines. The girls were accompanied by Mrs Chaudhry,
